Glasgow Council on Alcohol (GCA) is seeking to recruit a Course Tutor/trainer to join our Diploma in Integrative Counselling Team.

The Diploma in Integrative Counselling is 2-year course, credit rated at SCQF level 10 by the University of the West of Scotland, and validation from COSCA. GCA is one of the founding COSCA members and adheres to the COSCA ethical framework for good practice in counselling, psychotherapy and counselling skills. The team is seeking a course tutor/trainer who will support the delivery of the Diploma, working on an ongoing basis alongside a lead tutor to plan and facilitate classes.

The course tutor will be involved in supporting the Diploma team to deliver a CPD calendar and contribute to other COSCA courses delivered by GCA,

We are looking for an experienced Counsellor or Psychotherapist, registered with an appropriate professional body, with a passion for supporting students throughout their learning journeys, and who are willing to work towards, or hold a COSCA Trainers accreditation at Diploma level.

The course tutor will be embedded in one Diploma Class but will be expected to contribute to other classes when required and deliver on other COSCA courses provided by GCA and on CPD training workshops when required.
